Home Reading and Spellings:

*Your child needs to be reading at home on a regular basis to help build their stamina and fluency. This can be reading independently, to an adult or sibling, or being read to. Remember to use Accelerated Reader to quiz your books.

Spellings are included in the weekly homework and are also taught in school along with the spelling patterns they represent. They are test on a two weekly cycle

<u>Maths:</u>

Our Year 4 Times Table assessment is drawing closer and we really encourage you to practise these at home.

TT Rockstars is not the only way to do this. Not all of our children like TT Rockstars so if this is the case they will need to find other ways to practise them. Verbal recall is still one of the best ways to do this. Doing these regularly is the key to success!

In the assessment, they have 6 seconds to read, calculate and type their response to questions up to 12×12. **PE:** Our PE days are Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Weekly Homework:

Our homework will continue to be set on TEAMs and provided on paper.

Homework will continue to be set on a Thursday and due in the following Thursday. It will be marked in class on a Thursday afternoon.
